



Recommended material: 1/4" or 1/2" Birch Plywood.
Attach wall hangers directly to finished piece, or
attach to a 12" x 14" plywood backer.

WP-714 Wild Horse
approx. 10 1/2" Wide x 11 5/8" High

Note: This pattern contains many close cuts, and requires extreme care when cutting not to chip, or break some of the more fragile pieces. If you do happen to break off any pieces, set them aside, and glue them back on after you have finished cutting your item.

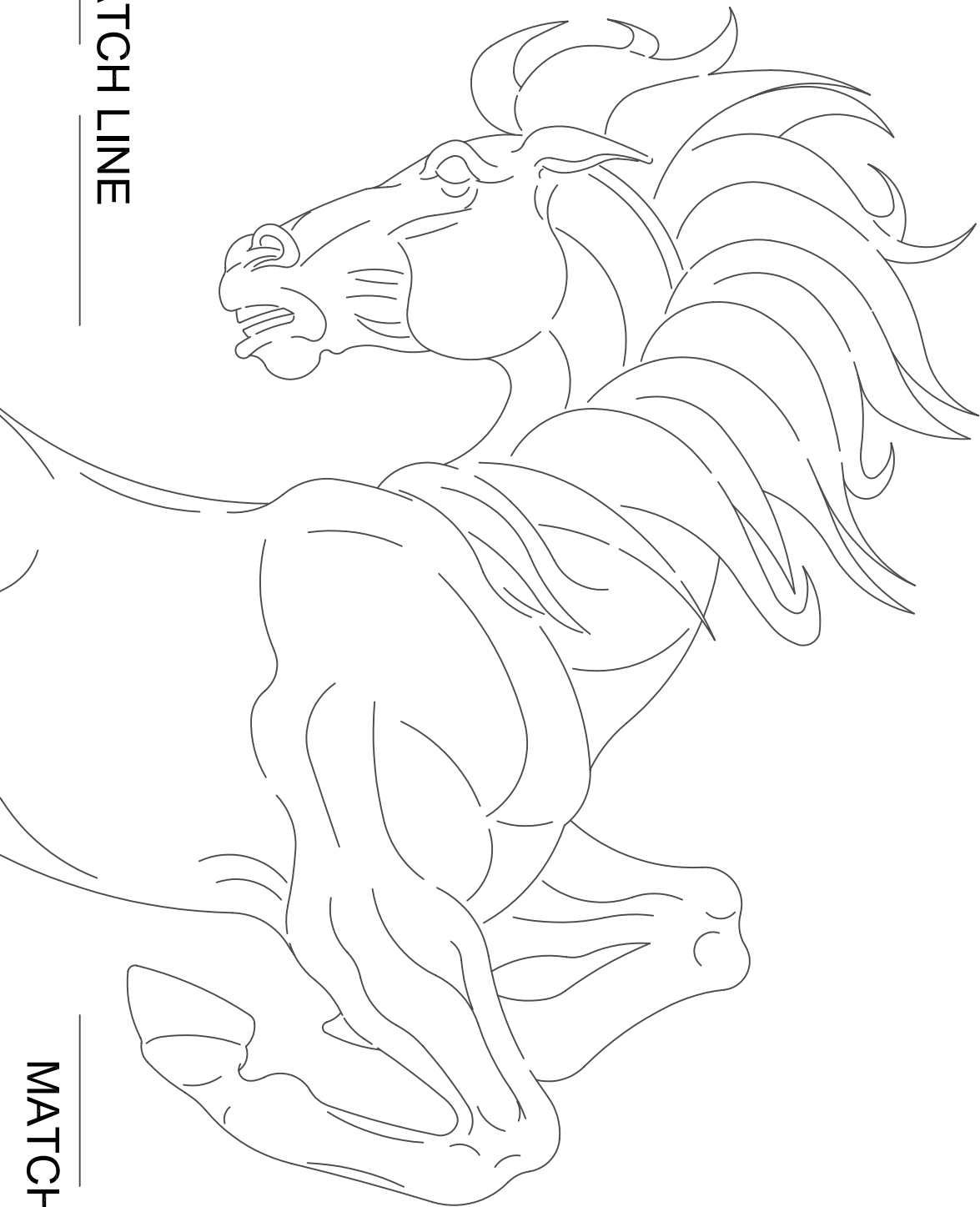
There are many ways to complete this project. Following are a few ideas to get you started.

1. Start with 1 or 2 pieces of material at least 12" wide x 14" high.
2. Cut the interior lines first, and work your way out. Be sure to stop your cuts as shown on the plan or you will have many pieces to glue back together.
3. Once the horse is completed, you can glue to a back board. Add a frame around the back board to give your item a unique look.
4. Finish the back board, and the horse with contrasting stains, or paint as desired.

Another way to do this is to:

1. Start with 1 or 2 pieces of material at least 12" x 14". Pick out Western Red Cedar with lots of "character" to create a special unique item.
2. Cut your lines as in the above example, but instead of stopping at the line breaks, continue your cuts so you have several pieces. Lightly sand the edges of all your pieces, giving them a slight angle. Stain mane and tail dark, horse body light, then glue all pieces back together. Finish as is, or add a backer and frame as mentioned above. (Note: make an extra copy of pattern to use for laying out pieces.)

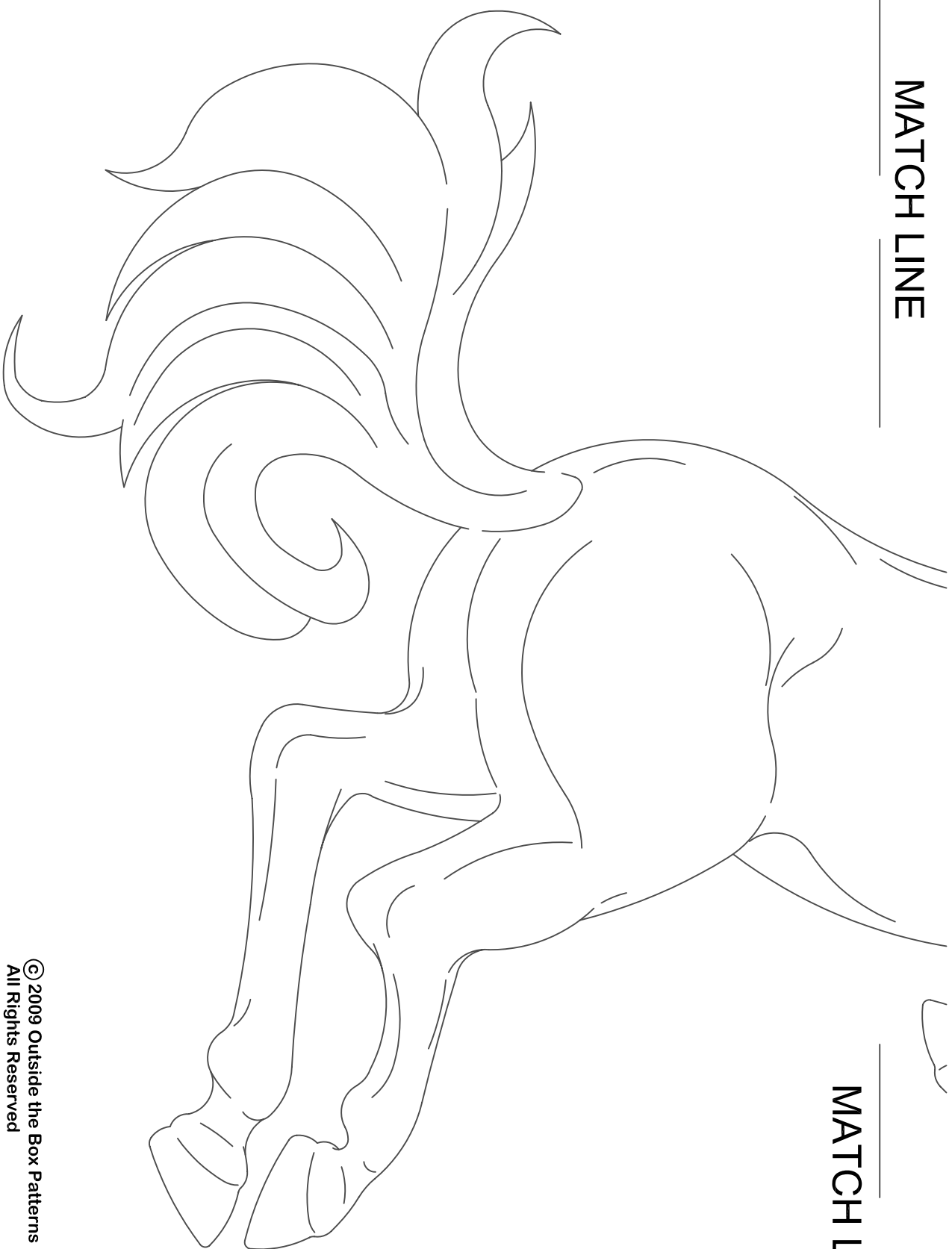
