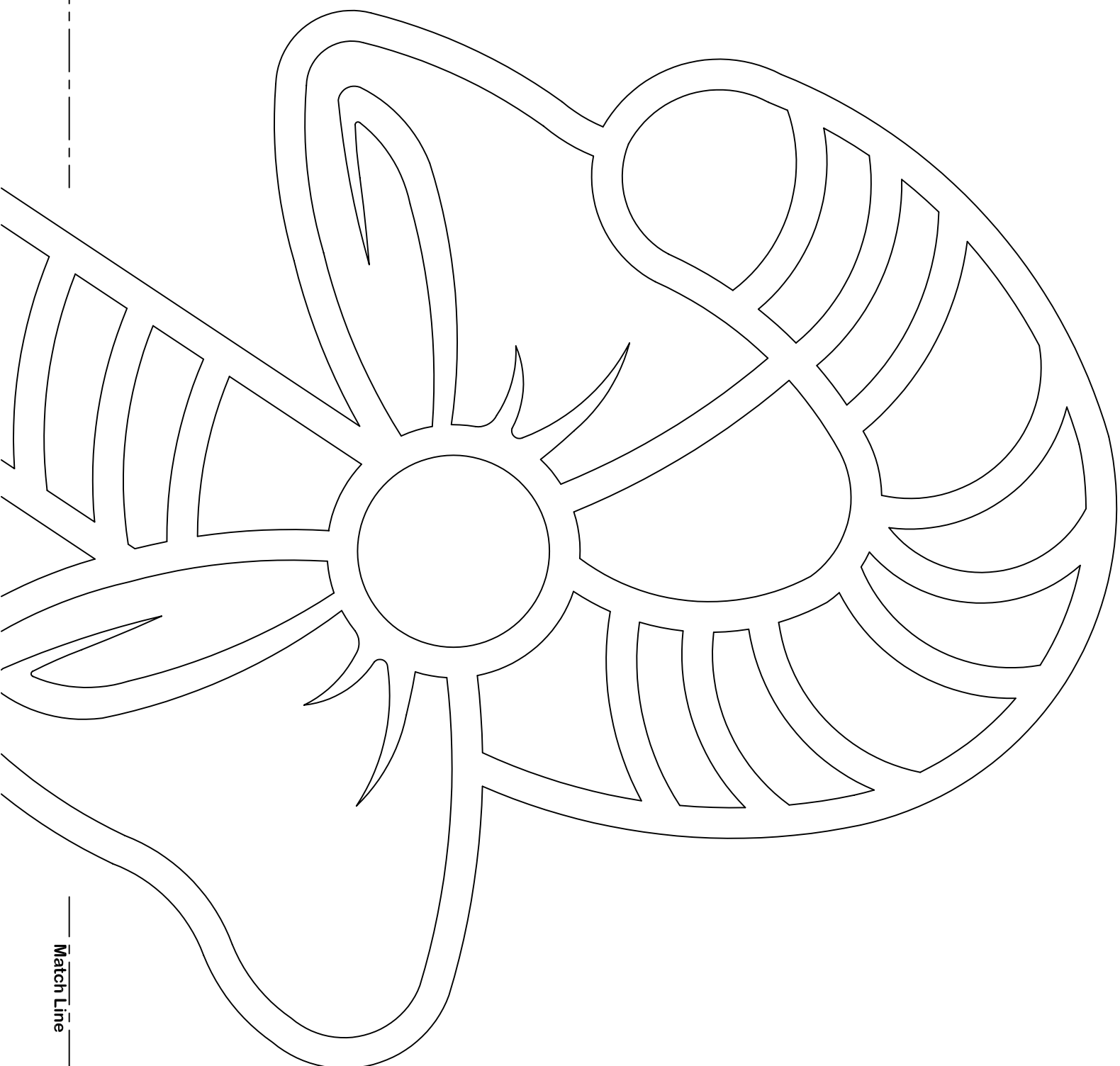


WP-759 Candy Cane by OTB Patterns

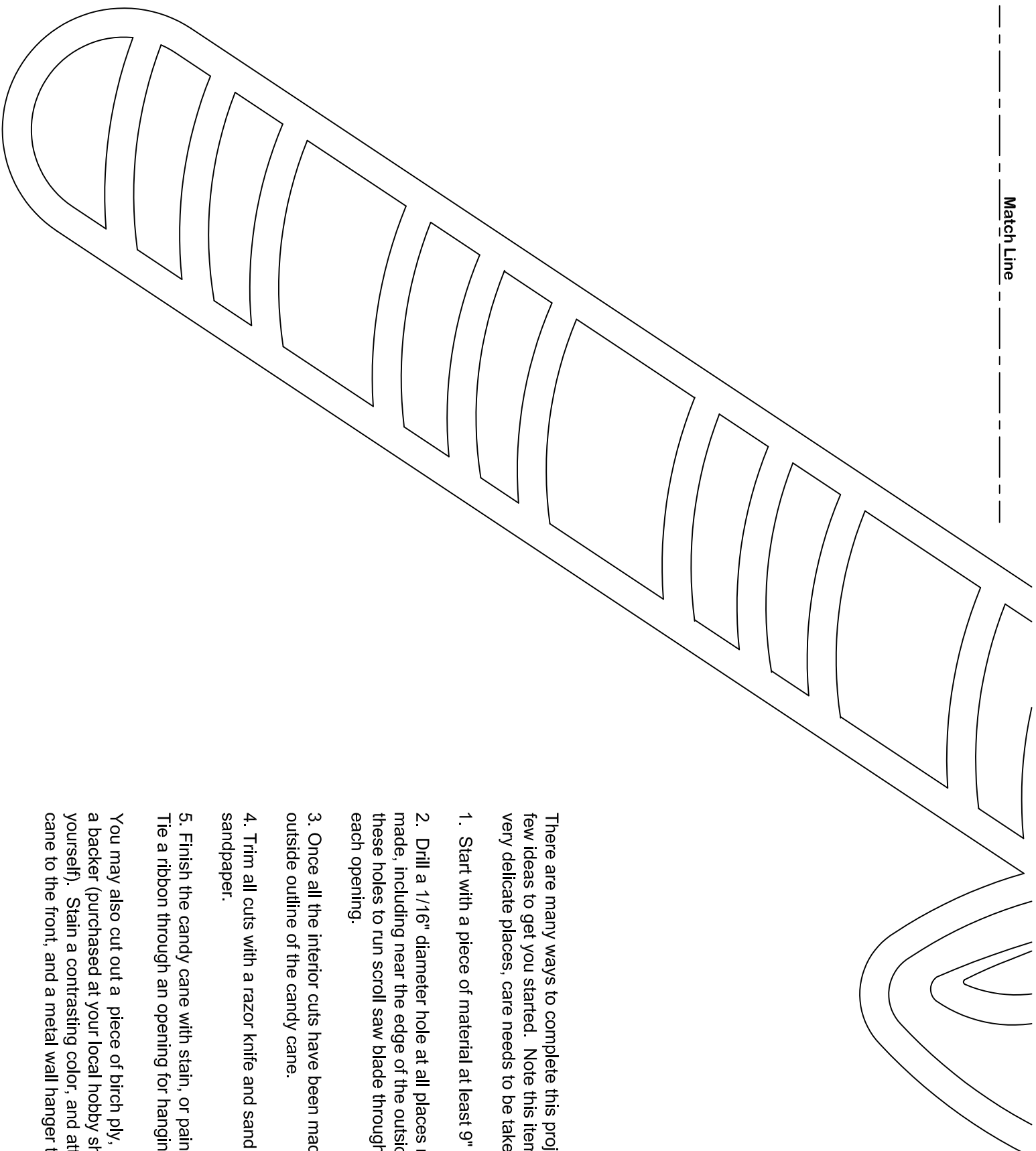

Match Line

There are many ways to complete this project. Following are a few ideas to get you started. Note this item contains a few very delicate places, care needs to be taken while cutting.

1. Start with a piece of material at least 9" wide by 17 1/2" tall.
2. Drill a 1/16" diameter hole at all places requiring cuts to be made, including near the edge of the outside cut line. Use these holes to run scroll saw blade through. Carefully cut out each opening.
3. Once all the interior cuts have been made, carefully cut the outside outline of the candy cane.
4. Trim all cuts with a razor knife and sand with 150 grit sandpaper.
5. Finish the candy cane with stain, or paint as desired. Tie a ribbon through an opening for hanging on the wall.

You may also cut out a piece of birch ply, or use a log slice as a backer (purchased at your local hobby shop, or sliced yourself). Stain a contrasting color, and attach your candy cane to the front, and a metal wall hanger to the back.
